

# Nike Men's French Terry Alumni Shorts

**Nike Men's French Terry Alumni Shorts** The Nike Men's French Terry Alumni Shorts are a comfortable and stylish option for casual wear, lounging, or light athletic activities.

## Features:

- **Material:** Made from soft French terry fabric, offering a balance of breathability and comfort.

- Common Complaints
- No Zipper Pocket: Less secure for keys/wallet (unlike the Jordan Hydro).
- Sizing: Runs slightly large (some buyers recommend sizing down).
- Durability: French terry may pill over time if washed aggressively.

- Nike.com: Check the "Sale" section or use student/military discounts.

- Stock Clearance Trick: Search "Nike Alumni Shorts [color] + [size]" on Google Shopping—small retailers often dump inventory cheap.
- Outlet Scam: Call local Nike Outlets and ask for "French Terry Shorts in stock"—many don't list online but have past-season pairs for ~\$29.99.

#### 1. "Elevated Dadcore" Fit:

- Top: Uniqlo U Airism Oversized Tee (tucked)
- Shoes: New Balance 990v6
- Accessory: Vintage Casio watch

## 2. "90s Hoops Nostalgia" Fit:

- Top: Mitchell & Ness NBA Jersey (oversized)
- Shoes: Air Jordan 4 "Bred"
- Socks: Nike Crew (folded over hem)

## 3. "Stealth Wealth" Fit:

- Top: Lululemon License to Train SS (heather grey)
- Shoes: Cole Haan Zerogrand
- Belt: Arc'teryx Conveyor (hidden under waistband)
